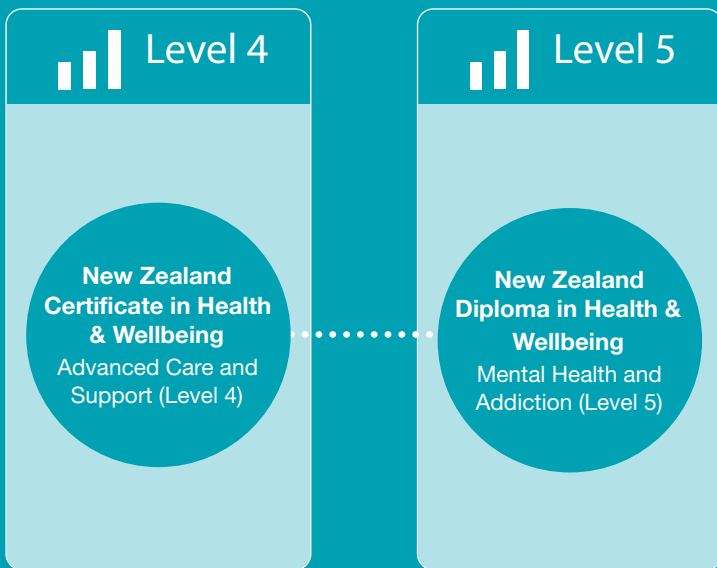

Eligibility

Applicants must be 20 years of age and:

- Completed all requirements of the New Zealand Certificate of Health & Wellbeing (Level 3); or
- An equivalent qualification in Health Assistance/Support work; or
- Completed a minimum of two years appropriate work or professional experience in a Health and Wellbeing role including but not limited to care giver, health assistant, or nurse.

Special Entry:

- An applicant 20 years of age or over, who does meet academic entry requirements, may be given entry to the programme if they can provide evidence of their likely success on the programme and following an interview.

Programme Outcome

Once you have successfully completed the New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Level 4) you will have the opportunity to work across a number of different community providers and organisations. Using the transferable skills and knowledge you have gained you will be able to provide high quality health and wellbeing services to those in need and their whānau.

You may also choose to progress into other programmes such as Aspire2's New Zealand Diploma in Health and Wellbeing (Mental Health and Addiction) (Practice/Applied Practice) (Level 5).

Eligibility

- Applicants must be 20 years of age or over.
- Applicants will be required to complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form. Any concerns arising from the Police check will be referred to the Academic Board for consideration regarding the applicant's admission. Applicants employed by a health industry provider are not required to undergo a Police check. Students may be required to undergo ongoing checks to ensure they are a fit and proper person to provide support in the health and wellbeing sectors.
- Applicants will be required to participate in an information session with a member of the academic staff (face to face or via technology). This session will allow for all parties to share information about the programme and the expectation of those enrolled in it. It may also include the applicant's abilities, physical/emotional support requirements, background, experiences and interests, possible career paths and motivation for study. Attendance of whānau members and/or other support people is encouraged. Applicants must also successfully demonstrate the ability to write at the equivalent of NZQA Level 3 at a minimum.
- Applicants must have: Completed all requirements of the New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Advanced Care and Support) (Level 4); OR completed an equivalent qualification in Health/Health and Wellbeing/Health support work; OR completed a minimum of one year of appropriate work or professional experience in a Health and Wellbeing role.

Programme Outcome

On completion of this programme you will apply the transferable skills and knowledge gained to provide high quality mental health and addiction services to those in need and help to support their whānau. Graduates will have the skills and knowledge required to work in vocational roles, disciplines or contexts in a range of settings such as non-governmental organisations, justice/corrections, social services, residential and community.
